

A Note From Father John LaVoe

With Advent, Christmas, and very soon Ash Wednesday and Lent at hand, three things may interest you. As of December 3rd, our Wednesday noon Holy Eucharists began at 11:45 AM. The reason is that a fifteen minute head start will help – in the kitchen, the dining room, AND allow more time in the chapel.

Second, I'm hoping we can go deeper with psalms in Lent. Are psalms poems, prayers, or songs? Are they somber, outrageous, or puzzling? They're not like gospels, epistles, history, laws or prophets, yet there's nothing "hard" about them. Register for two free sessions that make sense of psalms, and answer your questions. Make a highway in the Old Testament that sheds light on Palm Sunday, Good Friday, Easter and more! See for yourself: on Wednesday

February 18; then, part 2, on Wednesday March 4, 1:30 to 3:00 (or 3:30 TBD), at St Margaret's House.

Personal & Group Retreats at St Margaret's

St. Margaret's has meeting spaces for group meetings and overnight retreats. We also welcome members of the community to come and stay at St. Margaret's for personal retreats. Those staying at St. Margaret's have use of the house, library, and chapel during their stay. There are many quiet sitting areas for relaxation and contemplation. We have a lovely path to the Wayside Cross on our grounds. Personal retreats are unguided and offer guests a chance to unwind and reconnect with themselves.

Guest rooms are \$65 per night and include overnight accommodation and use of the house and the guest kitchenette, which has a refrigerator, microwave, toaster, and instant hot water for tea and coffee. Groups of five or more can also have meals included for a total cost of \$100 per night per person.
